This Will was proved at London the second  
day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand  
seven hundred and ninety six before the Right Honorable  
Sir William Wynne Knight Doctor of Laws Master  
Keeper or Comptroller of the prerogative Court of  
Cantebury lawfully constituted by the Oath of  
Martha Bingley the sister of the deceased and an  
sole Executrix named in the will to whom admou  
was granted of all and singular the goods Chattels  
and Credits of the deceased having been first  
sworn by Commission duly to administer

This is the last Will

hundred and eighty seven as follows first I charge  
all my personal Estate with the payment of my just

Margaret in Kings' Lynn aforesaid and whereas my  
late daughter Maria Georgiana Liddell Spinsters  
deceased in and by her last will and Testament  
bearing date on or about the ninth day of April  
thousand seven hundred and eighty five and also  
in and by another will or paper dated the twentieth  
first day of February providing and appoint John  
Esquire and Robert Partridge Esquire Executors and  
gave them jointly and severally a power for their  
in executing the same and did thereby give and  
bequeath unto them all her personal Estate after  
settling thereout the said debts and the charge of her  
funeral and the expences attending the execution of  
the Trust thereby reposed in them upon Trust that  
they pay the yearly interest and produce thereof  
unto me during my life and after my death and  
after giving several legacies she therein  
gave to her Aunt Isabella and Pleasant Hepburn  
twenty pounds a piece for mourning and also to her  
said Aunt Isabella Hepburn after my death she gave  
ten pounds a year during her life to be paid her by  
two equal half yearly payments and on her death  
she gave the sum of two hundred pounds to  
Swaine of Liverington late Miss Robertson and  
gave all the residue of her personal Estate after  
payment of the said legacies unto her Cousin Dorothy  
Young but notwithstanding any thing aforesaid she  
gave me Swaine Liddell full power to revoke  
or alter the above mentioned bequests and to give  
her personal Estate or any part of it to any other  
person or persons and to such purposes and in such  
manner as I shall think proper by my will now  
therefore by virtue and in pursuance of the power  
and powers to me given in and by the said in part  
written Will and Wills I do in and by this my last  
will and Testament revoke and alter the aforesaid  
bequest to the said Miss Swaine of Liverington late  
Miss Robertson and also so much of the said  
residuary legacy given as aforesaid to the said  
Dorothy Young as shall be necessary with the  
interest of the said two hundred pounds to raise  
or make up the sum of ten pounds a year during  
the life of the said Pleasant Hepburn in case she  
shall survive the said Isabella Hepburn her sister  
and in that case but not otherwise I give the sum  
of ten pounds a year during her life and I do direct  
the said Trustees named and appointed in my said  
daughters' will to pay the same to the said Pleasant  
Hepburn during her life as aforesaid the first payment  
to commence and be made six months after the

Death of the said Isabella Sheburn and not before and  
 also direct the said Trustees to postpone the payment  
 of the said two hundred pounds to the said M<sup>rs</sup> Swaine  
 of Livingston and the payment of such part of the  
 said ordinary Legacy to the said Dorothy Young as  
 shall be lawfully retained for the purpose aforesaid  
 until after the death not only of the said Isabella  
 Sheburn but also of the said Phisauri Sheburn and  
 then to pay the said two hundred pounds to the said  
 M<sup>rs</sup> Swaine her Executors or Administrators and  
 the sum to be retained out of the said ordinary  
 Legacy to the said Dorothy Young her Executors or  
 Administrators and to give and bequeath the several  
 and respective sums of money accordingly and in  
 whereas my said deceased daughter did after my  
 death in and by her said will and wills give to her  
 Cousin the said Dorothy Young the sum of two  
 hundred pounds now hereof by virtue and in  
 pursuance of the power and powers aforesaid to me  
 given and do further direct that the said two hundred  
 pounds shall be raised and paid out of the stock  
 left by my said daughter in the three per cent ann  
 bonds and out of no other fund and I hereby  
 give and empower her said Trustees to pay the  
 same accordingly and also in virtue of the power  
 and powers aforesaid to prevent any doubts which  
 may arise on the said in part written will and  
 wills I do direct the said several Legacies hereby  
 given (except the hereby bequeathed a piece to the  
 Executors) shall not be paid until six months  
 after my death being retained by my said daughter  
 intended the same should be respectively paid  
 at that time and not sooner and I give the same  
 accordingly and I do hereby confirm my said  
 deceased daughter's will and wills and the several  
 several bequests therein contained in all other  
 respects and lastly I give and bequeath all the  
 rest residue and remainder of my Goods Chattels  
 ready money plate Linn Shewels furniture  
 and personal Estate whatsoever and wheresoever  
 unto my said direct Dorothy Young for her own use  
 and appoint her sole Executrix of this my will  
 hereby revoking all former wills by me made in  
 which wherof I have herunto set my hand and  
 Seal the day and year above written  
 name or mark of Swanna Sidderdale  
 Signed, Sealed, published and declared by the  
 said Swanna Sidderdale her Testatrix as and for  
 her last will and Testament in the presence of M<sup>rs</sup>  
 who in her presence in the presence of each other  
 and at her request have subscribed our names as  
 witnesses Charles Long Jos<sup>ph</sup> Smith

This Will was proved at London the second day of November in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety six before the Right honorable Sir William Wynne Knight Doctor of Laws Master Chieft or Commissary of the prerogative Court of Canterbury lawfully constituted by the Cath. of Dorothy Young Spinster the Sister of the deceased and sole Executrix named in the Will to whom an Administration was granted of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the deceased having been first sworn by Common Oath to Admin.
