was proved at London the
 nineteenth day of April in the year of Our Lord One
 thousand seven hundred and eighty seven before the honorable
 George Harris Doctor of Laws and Surrogate of the Right
 honorable Peter Calvert Doctor of Laws Master Keeper of the
 Comptrolary of the prerogative Court of Canterbury lawfully
 constituted by the Oath of David La Porte the son of
 the deceased and sole Executor named in the said
 Will to whom Administration was granted of all and in
 singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said deceased
 as having been first sworn duly to Administer.

This is the last Will

and Testament of me Maria Georgiana Sidderdall of Kings
 Lynn in the County of Norfolk Single Woman made this
 ninth day of April 1785 first I appoint John Esq
 Esquire of Norfolk in the said County and Robert
 Esquire of the City of Norwich Executors of this
 my Will and give them Treaty full power for their
 double in executing the same Also I give and bequeath
 unto them all my personal Estate after deducting
 thereout the said Executors the charge of my funeral
 and the Expence attending the Execution of this Trust
 whereby repaid in them upon Trust that they pay
 the yearly Interest and produce thereof unto my
 affectionate dearly beloved and much honoured Mother
 during her life and after her Death I give to my Cousin
 Dorothy Young the sum of two hundred pounds also
 after my Mothers Death I give the sum of five hundred
 pounds to my honoured Father's Deceased Captain Thomas
 Sanders of Swaffham Norfolk and the sum of Twenty
 pounds apiece to my friends Mrs Alice of St Germans
 late Miss Turner and to Mrs Betts of Boston Lincolnshire
 late Mrs By-sill for a Ring and to my Aunt Isabella
 and pleasure Depburn I give Twenty pounds apiece for
 Annings also to my Aunt Isabella Depburn after
 my Mothers Death I give Ten pounds a year during
 our life to be paid her by two equal half yearly
 payments and on the Death of my said Aunt Isabella
 Depburn I give and bequeath the sum of two hundred
 pounds to Mrs Swaine of Beverton late Miss Rebecca
 and I give all the residue of my personal Estate after
 payment of the said Executors debts & will shall be
 made six Months after my Death unto my Cousin
 Dorothy Young my affectionate Sister friend and Relation
 but notwithstanding any thing aforesaid I give my
 dearly beloved Mother full power to receive or after the
 above mentioned bequests and to my personal Estate

I make this Codicil to my Will & will that my Cousin Dorothy Young shall have the Interest of the rest of my Stock in the three per Cent Consols for her life of her my said Cousin's life after the Death of my Cousin Dorothy Young I bequeath my Stock in the three per Cent Consol to my Cousin Eleonora Sutton on a Condition that my said Cousin pay one hundred pounds to her sister Mary Lidderdale one hundred pounds to her Sister Mary Brown fifty pounds to her sister Elizabeth Williamson Writings my hand this fifth day of April 1785. In Secret my Execution and Writings took to Miss Elizabeth Lyell of Boston Lincolnshire & have so many friends who have all an equal claim to my Remembrance that can only lament it is not in my power to leave them more than my sincerely affectionate wishes Maria Georgiana Lidderdale I altered the said Case was so obliging to write as it now appears and have written this rest that should not be understood

On which Day appeared personally Catherine the wife of Nicholas Stydeman Esquire and Anne Hamiltons Widow and made Oath that they know and were well acquainted with Maria Georgiana Lidderdale late of Kings Lynn in the County of Norfolk Spinster for several Years before and to the time of her Death which happened in the Month of January last and during which their knowledge of and Acquaintance with her the said deceased they have often seen her write and subscribe her name to Writings and having now carefully viewed and perused the paper Writing aforesaid annexed purporting to be the last Will and Testament of the said deceased with two Codicils and a Memorandum annexed the said Will beginning thus this is the last Will and Testament of me Maria Georgiana Lidderdale of Kings Lynn in the County of Norfolk Single Woman made this fifth day of April 1785 ending thus In Witness whereof I have hereto set my hand and seal the day and year above mentioned and thus subscribed "Maria Georgiana Lidderdale" the first

first of the said Codicils beginning thus "I make this my
Codicil to my Will" ending thus "Witness my hand this
twentieth day of April 1706 and thus subscribed "Maria Georgiana
Liddedale" second Codicil beginning thus "I bequeath my
diamonds and Music Book" ending thus "Affectionate
witness" and thus subscribed "Maria Georgiana Liddedale
and the Memorandum at the foot of the second
Codicil being in the words following: "I altered the
Will Mr. Care was so obliging to write as it now
appears and have written this last that should
not be understood they these Deponents do jointly
and severally depose that they do verily and in
their Conscience believe the whole of the said Will
Codicils and Memorandum beginning ending and so
subscribed as aforesaid to be all of the proper
handwriting and subscription of the said Maria
Georgiana Liddedale the Testatrix deceased Katherine
Stylerman Anne Hamilton James Bay sworn before Mr
Henry Grove Commissioner."

This Will was proved at London with
two Codicils the twentieth day of April in the year of Our
said Our thousand seven hundred and eighty seven before the
Right Reverend Peter Calvert Doctor of Laws Master Keeper
or Comptroller of the prerogative Court of Cantebury lawfully
constituted by the Oath of John Stone and Robert Partidge
Esquires the Executors named in the said Will to whom
Administration was granted of all and singular the Goods
Chattels and Credits of the said deceased they having
been first sworn duly to Administer by Commission

This is the last Will
and Testament of me John Leonard late of Cheltenham
in the County of Gloucester Gentleman but now of East
Grimstead in the County of Sussex made this twenty first
day of March in the year of Our Lord 1707 as follows
(that is to say) I desire that I will order and direct that
all my Just debts funeral Expenses and probate of this
my last Will and Testament be fully paid and satisfied
by my Executor hereinafter named whom I give devise
and bequeath all and singular my Estate and Effects to
whatsoever and whatsoever both Real and personal which
I may be possessed of unto my good friend Richard de
Thomas of East Grimstead aforesaid virtually to hold to
him his heirs and assigns for ever and so hereby I
nominate constitute and appoint the said Richard Thomas
sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament every
resolving and making void all former and other Will or
Wills by me at any time heretofore made and set forth
