of me Anne Lidderdale of Chingford in the County of Middlesex Widow & single
 that all my just debts funeral and testamentary expences be paid and satisfied by
 my exors admors & assigns named as soon as convenient may be after my decease and
 payment of just debts and bequests all and every my household furniture linen
 wearing apparel books plate pictures china and also all and every sum and sums
 of money which may be in my house or about my person or wheresoever be due
 to me or in any bank at the time of my decease and also all other my moneys or
 invested in stocks funds and securities for money debts due to me in any bills or
 annuities or other securities and all and every other my estate and effects a
 whatsoever and wheresoever both real and personal wheresoever in possession reversion or
 remainder or expectancy unto my daughters Elizabeth Pearce and Eleonora as a
 gift absolute for their own use and benefit absolutely provided they shall both sur-
 vive me and be unmarried at the time of my decease and in the event of the
 death or marriage of either of them in my life then the surviving unmarried
 shall take the whole of my estate and effects both real and personal and in the
 event of the death of both or the marriage of both or the death of one and the
 marriage of the other previous to my decease then I give and bequeath the whole
 of my estate and effects both real and personal to my children to be divided equal-
 ly among them their heirs and assigns and I do nominate constitute and ap-
 point my said daughters Elizabeth Pearce and Eleonora Lidderdale to be ex-
 ecutors of this my will and hereby revoke all former or other wills by me
 at any time heretofore made of record this to be my last will and testament
 in witness whereof I the said Anne Lidderdale have to this my last will and
 testament set my hand this 28th day of April in the year of our Lord one
 thousand eight hundred & forty nine
