of me Anne Lidderdale of Chingford in the County of Middlesex Widow & single
that all my just debts funeral and testamentary expences be paid and satisfied by
my exors admors & assigns named as soon as convenient may be after my decease and
that I give devise and bequeath all and every my household furniture linen
writing apparel books plate pictures china and also all and every sum and sum
of money which may be in my house or about my person or wheresoever be due
to me or in any bank at the time of my decease and also all other my moneys or
invested in stocks funds and securities for money debts due to me in any bills or
promises or other securities and all and every other my estate and effects a
whatevver and wheresoever both real and personal whatevver in possession reversion or
contingency or expectancy unto my daughters Elizabeth Pearce and Elanora as a
dower for their own use and benefit absolutely provided they shall both sur-
vive me and be unmarried at the time of my decease and in the event of the
state or marriage of either of them in my life that the surviving unmarried
out shall take the whole of my estate and effects both real and personal and in a
the event of the state of both or the marriage of both or the state of one and the
marriage of the other previous to my decease that I give and bequeath the whole
of my estate and effects both real and personal to my children to be divided equal-
ly among them their heirs and assigns and I do nominate constitute and do
appoint my said daughters Elizabeth Pearce and Elanora Lidderdale to be ex-
ors admors & assigns of this my will and do revoke all former or other will by me
at any time heretofore made of bequeath this to be my last will and testament
and witness whereof I the said Anne Lidderdale have to this my last will and
testament set my hand this 28th day of April in the year of our Lord one in
thousand eight hundred & forty nine
